

# Abigail Baby Girl Cardigan

## A Cre8tion Crochet Original

This is the first sweater I have ever made let alone written a pattern for. It is sweet and delicate and really easy to make. This sweater would also be cute for a boy, using neutral or more gender specific colors. I ended up not adding any embellishment to this cardigan because I really liked the simplicity of it. 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## **YARN**

275 yards of thin worsted weight yarn in main color and small amount for border, I used Carons Simply Soft in soft pink and soft heather grey, other worsted weight yarns may produce different results, please check your gauge.

## **MATERIALS**

5.5mm (I) hook

Yarn needle

## **DIFFICULTY**

Easy

## **SIZE(S)**

10" at longest height

9 1/2" at widest part across chest

9" from top of should to end of sleeves

This sweater should comfortably fit a baby 6-12 months old.

## **GAUGE**

13 sts and 7 rows = 4" x 4"

## **STITCH GUIDE**

mc - main color, bc - border color, ch(s) - chain(s), sc - single crochet, hdc - half double crochet, dc - double crochet, st(s) - stitch(es), RS - right side,

## **SPECIAL STITCHES**

**dc3tog**- double crochet three together

YO, insert hook in first st, YO, pull up loop, draw through first two loops on hook (two loops remaining on hook), \*YO insert hook in next st, YO, pull up loop, draw through first two loops on hook\*\* (three loops remaining on hook). Repeat from \* to \*\* (four loops remaining on hook). YO and draw through all four loops on hook.

**dc2tog**- double crochet two together

yarn over (YO), insert hook into first st, YO and draw up a loop, (three loops on hook), YO and pull through first two loops (two loops remaining on hook), YO, insert hook in next st, YO and draw up a loop (four loops on hook), YO, pull through first two loops on hook, YO and pull through remaining three loops.

## **NOTES**

- Ch 3 is considered the first dc. The next dc will be placed in the 2nd st from hook.
- Ch 1 is NOT considered the first st.
- Body of sweater is worked in rows, raglan style.
- Sleeves are stitched into body in rounds.

## **PATTERN**

### **YOKE**

**Row 1:** Ch 45, turn, 1sc in each st across. <44>

**Row 2:** Ch 3, dc in each of the next 2sts, 2 dc in the next st, \*dc in each of the next 3sts, 2 dc in the next st, repeat from \* to end <55>

**Row 3:** Ch 3, dc in each of the next 3sts, 2 dc in the next st, \*dc in each of the next 4sts, 2 dc in the next st, repeat from \* to end <66>

**Row 4:** Ch 3, dc in each of the next 4sts, 2 dc in the next st, \*1dc in each of the next 5sts, 2 dc in the next st, repeat from \* to end <77>

**Row 5:** Ch 3, dc in each of the next 5sts, 2 dc in the next st, \*1dc in each of the next 6sts, 2 dc in the next st, repeat from \* to end <88>

**Row 6:** Ch 3, dc in each of the next 6sts, 2 dc in the next st, \*1dc in each of the next 7sts, 2 dc in the next st, repeat from \* to end <99>

**Row 7:** Ch 3, dc in each of the next 7sts, 2 dc in the next st, \*dc in each of the next 8sts, 2 dc in the next st, repeat from \* to end <110>

### **SEPARATE FOR SLEEVES**

**Row 8:** Ch 3, dc in each of the next 14sts, ch 3 and skip 24sts, dc in each of the next 32sts, ch 3 and skip 24sts, dc in each of the next 15sts

**Row 9:** Ch 3, dc in each of the next 14sts, dc in each of the 3 chs, dc in each of the next 32sts, ~~dc in each of the 3 chs, dc in each of the next 15sts.~~

**Rows 10 - 19:** Ch 3, dc in each of the next 67 sts, on last st change to border color. <68>

**Row 20:** Ch 1 and sc in same st, sc in each st <68>

**Row 21:** Ch 1 and sc in same st, sc in each st <68>

### **EDGING**

I like the design feature of the gaps where the edging meets the body; if you do not want gaps in your edging, place your sts in the ch 3/dc at the ends of rows as opposed to the spaces made by the ch 3/dc as written in pattern.

Working up the front of the sweater, 2 sc in each ch3 space (16 spaces), sc in the top row and continue to sc around the entire neck. Working back down the front, sc in the top row, 2 sc in each of the ch3 spaces (16 spaces) and fasten off at bottom. Fasten off and weave in ends

### **SLEEVES**

**Round 1:** Attach yarn with sl st under arm, in st before the three underarm ch sts, ch 3, dc3tog in the 3 underarm ch sts, dc in each of the next 27sts <29>

**Round 2:** Ch 3, dc2tog, dc in each of the next 26 sts <28>

**Round 3:** Ch 3, dc2tog, dc in each of the next 25sts <27>

**Round 4:** Ch 3, dc2tog, dc in each of the next 24 sts <26>

**Round 5:** Ch 3, dc2tog, dc in each of the next 23 sts <25>

**Rounds 6-12:** Ch 3, dc in every st around <25>

**Round 13:** Change to border color. Ch 1, sc in the same st and in every st around, sl st into first sc to join.

Repeat for other sleeve

### **FINISHING**

Fasten off and weave in all ends

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
